Mason became Acting Governor of the Michigan Territory.</p>

His survey found lots of good farmland.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><b>Later in 1834</b></p> <p>There was a conflict between Michigan and Ohio over the "Toledo Strip."</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><b>1825</b></p> <p>The Erie Canal opened. This made it easier and faster for settlers to get to Michigan.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><b>1805</b></p> <p>Michigan became the Michigan Territory.</p>
<p style="text-align: center;"><b>1818</b></p> <p>Steamboats made it easier and quicker for settlers to get to Michigan.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><b>1835</b></p> <p>Michigan voters adopted the state's first constitution and elected Stevens T. Mason as governor.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><b>1816</b></p> <p>An early survey of Michigan was done. A report of the survey said Michigan would not be good for farming.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><b>1836</b></p> <p>The problem between Michigan and Ohio was solved.</p>
